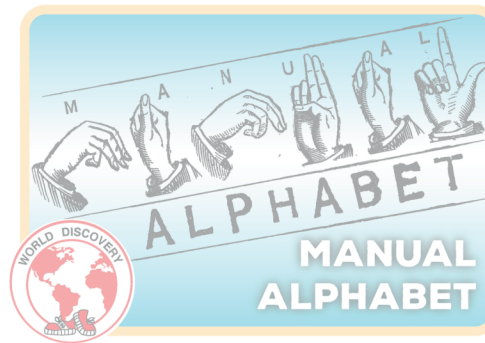

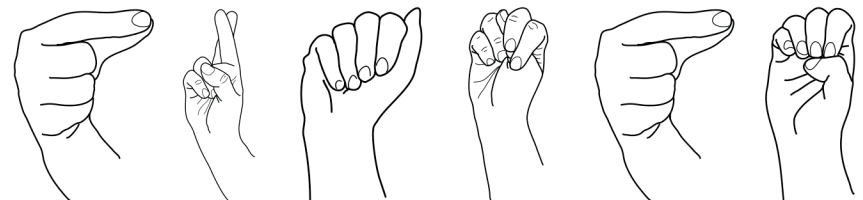
The purpose of this passport is to educate Junior Grangers on American Sign Language, the Deaf community, and some basic sign language.
